Celebrating the 81<sup>st</sup> Anniversary of the Achievements of the Tuskegee Airmen



East Coast Chapter of Tuskegee Airmen Inc. (ECCTAI) is the largest and the most active chapter in the national organization. The chapter has approximately **180 members** with diverse backgrounds that include active duty and retired military, civil servants, and private citizens from all walks of life. More than 50 Chapter members are **Documented Original Tuskegee Airmen** (DOTAs), combat veterans of World War II who received their military training at Tuskegee, Alabama.

Locally, ECCTAI supports many educational, charitable and philanthropic activities, including the Tuskegee Airmen Civil Air Patrol (CAP) Squadron. Chapter members enthusiastically participate in the annual District of Columbia National Guard Aviation Career Day. This event, held at Andrews Air Force Base, attracts more than **2,000 young students** each year and gives students the opportunity to meet and talk with members of the military, airline industry, scientific and educational community, as well the Federal, State, and local government organizations as they present career and employment opportunities.

ECCTAI is a duly chartered US 501 (c) (3) nonprofit corporation.



### **PROGRAMS**

Tuskegee Airmen Scholarship Foundation and in Youth in Aviation

The ECCTAI **Youth in Aviation Program** (YIAP) started as an idea from <u>Lonely Eagles</u> Bill Broadwater and Ted Robinson back in 1996 in keeping with the Chapter's basic charge to continue the Tuskegee legacy and inspire minority youth.

### YIAP



**Level I** is designed to expose high school students (ages 15 - 19) to possible careers in aviation through discussions, activities, guest speakers and field trips.



**Level II** is designed for the serious student who has decided s/he is interested in becoming a pilot.



**Level III**, the flying portion of the program, is held during the summer for students who have successfully completed Level II.

### COMMEMORATION DAY TRIBUTE AND CELEBRATION



#### To honor the **Tuskegee Airmen** Legacy

The East Coast chapter of the legendary Tuskegee Airmen will host its 81st Anniversary with a Commemoration Day Tribute and Celebration, featuring a collection of exclusive events and fundraising activities. The wreath laying ceremony and a special tribute will honor the Lonely Eagles, with a presentation by the Howard University ROTC, at The United States Air Force Memorial on the **24th March 2022**. The Tuskegee Airmen 81st Anniversary Celebration will highlight the accomplishments of our special invited guests and performers, with a posthumous award to honor General Colin L. Powell, former U.S. Secretary of State and Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

The funds raised will go towards ongoing educational and community outreach

programming including the <u>scholarship fund</u>, <u>Herbert H Jones Youth In Aviation Program</u>, and general operating expenses.

East Coast Chapter of Tuskegee Airmen Inc.

The Tuskegee Airmen were collectively, not individually, awarded the Congressional Gold Medal (CGM) by President George W. Bush and the U.S. Congress on March 29, 2007 at a ceremony inside the Rotunda of the U.S. Capitol. The 300 airmen and widows, who attended the ceremony, received the CGM for all of the estimated **16-19,000** participants of the "Tuskegee" Experience," who are known as Documented Original Tuskegee Airmen or DOTA. The CGM was taken to the Smithsonian Institution (National Air and Space Museum) immediately following the ceremony, where it now sits.
